Skate Kingston Refund Policy:

Requests must be made in writing before the 3rd week of skating. Fees will be prorated. Requests for refund after this time are at the discretion of the board and a medical note is mandatory. A \$45 non-refundable insurance and administrative fee will apply. **NSF cheque charge \$30.00.**

No refunds will be given for loss of ice out of Skate Kingston's control and any makeup ice is at the discretion of the City of Kingston.

PROGRAMS - Spring 2023 (April - May 2023)

CanSkate INVISTA Centre, CUPE 109 Ice Pad (8 classes):

- Tuesday 6:20 7:05 pm (April 4 May 23)
- Wednesday 6:20 7:05 pm (April 5 May 24)
- Thursday 5:50 6:35 pm (April 6 May 25)

CanSkate is a 45-minute program taught in a group format by certified coaches and focuses on continuous movement emphasizing the use of dynamic group teaching concepts including fast track, fun zone and station rotation. The CanSkate curriculum is organized into three fundamental areas; Balance, Control and Agility which concentrate on forward and backward skills, stopping, edges, speed, turning and jumping. Skaters will receive ongoing incentives and a report card at the end.

Pre-Can is a sub-group on the Canskate session that is for non-skaters who stay in their own area of the ice. Coaches will determine if skaters need to be in Pre-Can or can be placed in another group as they progress during the session. We look at the information that you provide in the PARTICIPANT Profile on Uplifter to help determine all Skater placements in groups.

NOTE: To be eligible for Spring 2023 CanSkate or Pre-Can, skaters MUST BE 4 years old or turning 4 years old by May 31, 2023.

Cost: \$176.00 + \$44.00 Mandatory Skate Canada & Safe Sport Fee (if not already paid)= \$220.00

Pre-STAR INVISTA Centre, CUPE 109 Ice Pad:

- Monday 5:50 6:35 pm (7 classes; April 3 May 29) no classes on Easter Monday or Victoria Day
- Wednesday 5:10 5:55 pm (8 classes; April 5 May 24)

The Pre-Star Program (Pre-Star) is a program that serves as a transition between CanSkate and STARSkate. This program is geared to skaters who show an interest in figure skating and have a basic skating background. Skaters generally have completed CanSkate Stage 4 badge or have been recommended to register by a coach, and will continue to work on remaining CanSkate badges. Please note that skaters <u>must wear figure skates</u>. Skaters will receive ongoing incentives and a report card at the end of the session.

This program shares ice with another program.

Cost:

Monday Pre-STAR: \$166.00 + \$44.00 Mandatory Skate Canada Fee (if not already paid)= \$210.00 Wednesday Pre-STAR: \$186.00 + \$44.00 Mandatory Skate Canada Fee (if not already paid)= \$230.00

Adult & Teen Learn-to-Skate INVISTA Centre, CUPE 109 Ice Pad:

• Monday 5:50 – 6:35 pm (7 classes; April 3 – May 29) – no classes on Easter Monday or Victoria Day

Adults and teenagers (12 years and older) can enjoy a 45-minute program learning to skate or improving base skills in a relaxed and friendly group lesson atmosphere. Session includes a 45-minute group lesson with a certified coach. Skaters receive ongoing incentives and a report card at the end of the session. This program is on at the same time and ice as the Pre-STAR session.

Skate Canada Helmet Policy:
